The goal of all "Fourwheelers" is using their vehicles in the beautiful countryside. Conservation is using the countryside so we will be able to use it again.


Take out what you bring in.


Do not destroy that which nature can not repair.

RUNS

Prospective members are required to attend 3 runs before becoming eligible for membership.

We have one run (trip) every month, except December, when we have our annual Christmas Bash.

All runs leave from the same place: the corner of Inglewood and Manhattan Beach Blvds., Lawndale.Meet in front of Winchell's Donuts. (Convenient!)Dates and times are announced at each meeting and in the club newsletter.

A flyer is handed out prior to each run giving all the details. If you have any questions, call the wagon-master-he's a kind soul, happy to help.

It's not necessary to notify anyone if you plan to go: just be there.

Runs are varied; we try to have all kinds: easy, rough, scenic, mountain, desert, and sand. There's usually an event on the runs- you're welcome to participate (and even win).

ON THE WAY

We usually travel in a caravan, but there's no obligationgo on ahead or join the group later if you wish. But-sometimes the chosen campsite is unavailable, or the trusty wagon-master gets lost and can't find it, so do try to be with the group when we leave the pavement.

There is usually a jump-off point, fairly close to our destination, where we pick up stragglers, gas up, and grab a bite to eat. To avoid delays, gas up before eating- when we go, we're gone! Ample time is allowed to eat and do whatever.

On the highway, stay within 1 or 2 vehicles of the wagon-master, as middle and tail-end vehicles have special responsibilities. Anyway, he's <u>supposed</u> to know the way!

Don't stop on the freeway unless absolutely necessary. If a vehicle pulls off, the following club member will go with him, unless he radios otherwise.

Maintain legal speeds, and don't bunch up.

The guy behind is your responsibility- if you lose sight of him, slow down or stop. Radio ahead, if possible.

If you wish to depart from the group, fine- but please notify the wagon-master when you leave.

To avoid mass confusion, only one person will direct any emergency actions, usually the wagon-master.

The wagon-master leads the entire run. He's the one to check with if you have any questions. If he doesn't have the answer, he'll direct you to the one that does.

If you feel an area is to difficult for your vehicle or driving experience, use another route- we'll wait. No malicious harassment, embarassment will be tolerated, but good-natured ribbing is part of the game.

Route markers are often used- recognize them: a small red "TRW" sign stapled to a grape-stake, usually giving specific directions.

Campfire- some say the best part of the trip- is held every evening after supper. Pull up a chair and join in, it usually doesn't get too rowdy! Bring your favorite libation, but be prepared to share.

You're expected to be completely self-contained, but if you run short (and we all do), don't be afraid to ask around for whatever you need.

If you lose the group, stop! Yell on the C-B if you have one, but don't wander around. We'll come after you.
