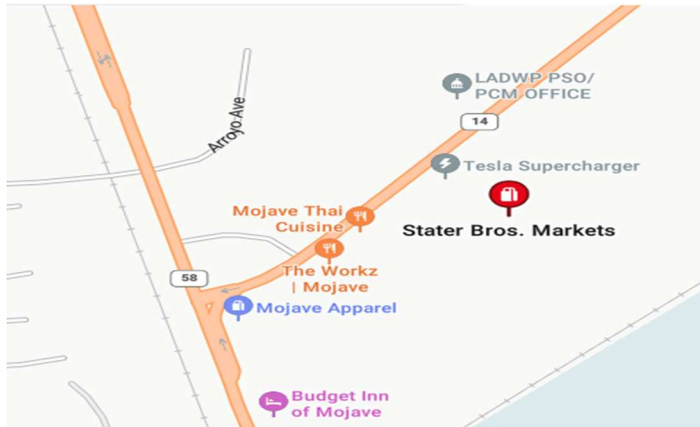

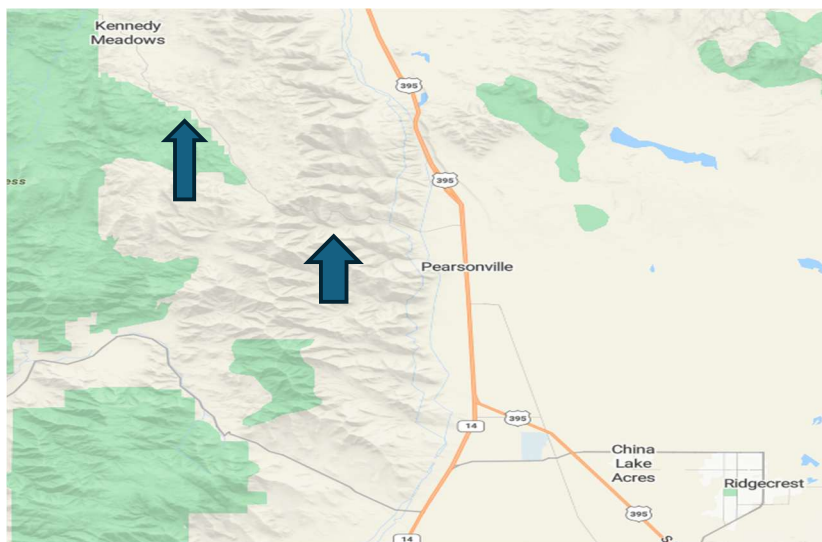
Meet-up on Friday, September 25th @ 7:00 am Stater Brothers Market, 16920 Hwy 14, Mojave CA

Kennedy Meadows is located along the Pacific Crest Trail in the Inyo National Forest, 28 miles west of Highway 395 (48 miles south of Lone Pine). Elevation: 6,100 feet

Kennedy Meadow Road is a left turn after Pearsonville. The road is paved along its entire length but includes steep switchbacks, grades, and tight turns. Fuel and services are limited; so we will stop in Pearsonville for last gas fill.



This will be a camping, fishing, dirt bike riding, hiking trip (no off-roading). Large motorhomes are not recommended as the dispersed camping spot has limited area. (Randy & Doug will be towing small trailers with pick-up trucks).

Stage 1 fire restrictions are in effect for Inyo National Forest. A campfire permit is required to use a portable stove or any open flame. There is no cell service, but Kennedy Meadows General Store may provide access to their wi-fi. They also have a few groceries, showers, toilets, and very expensive gas.



The Cook Shack at the Kennedy Meadows General Store is a beloved hub of hearty food and warm camaraderie, especially for Pacific Crest Trail hikers reaching this iconic milestone. Tucked beside the main store, the Cook Shack dishes out hot, satisfying meals like burgers, breakfast burritos, pancakes, and fresh coffee—fuel for hungry trekkers and road-trippers alike. With its no-frills, down-home style and friendly service, the Cook Shack is more than just a place to eat—it's where trail stories are shared, friendships are made, and spirits are lifted. For many, a stop at the Cook Shack marks both a culinary and emotional turning point on their journey north (or south).

Open from 7-9AM for Breakfast and 11AM-5PM for Lunch.
